



The Juxtapose Scarf

Inspired by the Habu Mohair Sweater, no. 110. I loved the combination of the ultra fine mohair, silky and soft with the heavier tsumugi silk, and wanted to apply it to a thin scarf.

Gauge: 3.5 stitches per 1 inch (although it is not too important, being a scarf)

Yarn: 1 oz. of Habu tsumugi silk, and 0.5 oz of Habu silk mohair

Needle Size: 5.0mm and 4.5mm circular or straight needles

Part 1:

Using 5mm needles and tsumugi silk, CO 150 stitches, knit 2 rows.

Part2:

Switch to 4.5mm and the silk mohair, knit 18 rows in garter stitch.

Row 19: knit 1, *yarn over, k2tog* repeat until the end

Row 20: knit 1 row

Row 21: knit 2, *yarn over, k2tog* repeat until the end

Row 22-27: knit 6 rows of garter stitch.

Part 3:

Switch back to 5mm needles and the tsumugi silk and knit 2 rows and then cast off.
